City of Salem/MBTA Announce Flexible Pass Program

The City of Salem and MBTA have launched a commuter pilot program for the summer 2009 season to introduce the MBTA monthly passes on Salem Ferry service for select trips. Details are provided below. The monthly MBTA Zone 5 - 8 Commuter Rail and MBTA Commuter Boat Passes will be honored as valid fare on the Salem Ferry for the following weekday commuter trips: 7:00 a.m. from Salem; the 5:10 p.m. and 7:10 p.m. from Boston's Long Wharf and 5:25 p.m. and 7:25 p.m. from the Salem Ferry's newest stop at the World Trade Center dock in the Seaport District. The City of Salem owns one 149 passenger high speed catamaran named the Nathaniel Bowditch, which it leases to the private ferry company, Water Transportation Alternatives (WTA). The services operates between Memorial Day and October 30.

Member Interview

City of Salem employee Danielle McKnight—Staff Planner

NSTMA: How do you currently commute to and from work?

Danielle: I carpool with two other City employees most days.

<u>NSTMA</u>: How long have you been commuting this way and how far do you travel each way?

Danielle: I've been carpooling since I started working in Salem, in November 2008. The trip for me is about 22 and a half miles each way from my carpool, which leaves from Medford. I live about two miles farther from that.

<u>NSTMA</u>: Have you figured out how much money you save per week/per month/per year?

Danielle: I save about half a tank of gas a week, which is roughly \$15 right now. That adds up to about \$60 each month, or \$720 a year.

NSTMA: How has the NSTMA helped the employees of the City of Salem?

Danielle: The carpool matching service would have been very helpful if I hadn't already found two other City employees who happen to live near me. If I didn't work closely with both of them, I might never have figured that out without the assistance of the ridematching database and TMA staff.

NSTMA: What do you like best about the NSTMA benefits?

Danielle: A huge advantage to the program is the <u>Guaranteed Ride Home program</u>. If an emergency or unplanned overtime ever comes up and I haven't taken my car that day, I'll still be able to get home. I don't need to worry about being stranded. I'm also excited about the financial incentives – I'll likely get a \$25 gift card after three months of carpooling, since I usually earpool at least twice a week.
